ABOUT THE JUNIOR LEAGUE

OUR MISSION

The Junior League of Lancaster (JLL) is an organization of women whose mission is to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration, and training. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

OUR HISTORY

On November 13, 1923, the Junior League of Lancaster held its first meeting at the YWCA in Lancaster City. Fifty-five young women were in attendance, and Laura Watt, temporary chairman, was elected the first president.

Today, the JLL continues the commitment that began over 100 years ago — connecting and supporting women of all races, religions, and national origins who demonstrate a commitment to voluntarism.

Our efforts support community-based partnerships that work to broaden the educational, culture, recreational, and health opportunities available to women and children within the Lancaster community.



President James Buchanan's Wheatland was acquired by the JLL in 1936 to be preserved for public education and enjoyment as a National Historic Landmark. Today, JLL Headquarters is located in the Carriage House on Wheatland grounds, all of which is maintained by LancasterHistory.

FUNDRAISING EVENTS

The Fund Development committee is proud to report that the Junior League of Lancaster had several successful Fund Development events throughout the 2023-2024 league year, including events with Boombox, Lancaster Cupcake, and Rada Cutlery. We also continued our participation in the Extraordinary Give, during which we were able to raise \$10,339.90! We also had a great year of giving from our Cornerstones sponsors who were excited to help us celebrate 100 years of The Junior League. They contributed \$16,000 for the 2023-2024 year!

In addition to our Cornerstone sponsor contributions the JLL raised approximately \$27,000 through fundraising events and charitable giving, which includes \$5,659.72 raised during the 2023 Cornhole Classic, \$10,339.90 raised during the ExtraGive event, and \$10,836.72 raised during the 19th Annual Run4Luck.


NEW MEMBERS IMPACT NUTRITION ACCESSIBILITY

During the 2023-2024 League year, the Junior League of Lancaster welcomed 14 new members, known as Provisional Members. To achieve Active status, each class was tasked with planning and executing a Provisional Member Project that supports the Lancaster community and aligns with our focus on nutrition accessibility. Under the guidance of the Membership Development Committee and League peers, these projects included:

The Fall Provisional Class partnered with the Lancaster Public Library to fund and stock a snack cart in the Teen and Young Adult section, providing healthy snacks for teens who visit the library after school. This thoughtful initiative helps bridge the gap from lunchtime until students can eat at home. Working with the library, the provisionals researched snack options and identified effective ways to keep the cart stocked. At the September 2023 General Membership Meeting, they raised \$339 through a "pass the hat" donation effort. The cart has been operating since October 2023 and is a hit with library visitors.

NEW MEMBERS IMPACT NUTRITION ACCESSIBILITY

The Spring Provisional Class continued the work of the Fall Class, focusing on creating a sustainable plan for the Lancaster Public Library snack cart. Collaborating closely with the Fall team, they developed a sustainability package that included marketing materials outlining various sponsorship levels, social media posts, an Amazon wishlist, and a sample donation letter to help secure ongoing support. The Junior League of Lancaster contributed \$1,000 to jumpstart the project, which the Provisionals presented to the library alongside their sustainability plan. They also shared their project with both the Junior League of Lancaster Board and the Sustainer Committee.

Shannon Schinagl, Early Literacy Coordinator at the library, shared a touching story of a teen who relies on the snack cart for regular nourishment:

"I know the teens love having snacks, but this encounter showed me that this simple and generous snack cart is actually keeping some young adults fed and full when they don't have access to food. What a true gift it is."





COMMUNITY IMPACT

Since 2022, our trained legion of JLL volunteers embarked on several collaboratives, creative projects, and long-term programming endeavors within our JLL focus area, all rooted with the intention of creating measurable reform within Lancaster County to combat the social, economic, and health implications of food and nutrition accessibility within our geographic imprint. During the 2023-2024 League year, JLL volunteers facilitated a number of impactful projects, focusing on 5 key priorities:

Direct Service

- Deployed committed volunteers to organize, sort, and box non-perishable goods and nutrient-dense recipes for children and families who receive weekend meals from Power Packs Project.
- Joined the Central Market in their after-market program initiative, ensuring
 they can scale up to meet the needs of food bank utilizers. After market closes
 for the day, Stand-holders offer free goods expiring before the next Market
 Day. The program is designed to ensure nutritious food ends up on local tables
 rather than go to waste.
- Served a free, nutritious meal to all members at Arch Street Center.
- Served a free, hot nutritious meal at Boys & Girls Club, followed by a facilitated art activity focusing on female leadership.
- Assisted in packing Holiday Meal boxes with Lancaster Project for the Needy.







COMMUNITY IMPACT Continued...

Collaborative Efforts

- Hosted a collaborative volunteer day at the York County Food Bank, alongside York Junior League. This provided an opportunity for fellowship and learning opportunities amongst leagues. Members packed 1,000 food boxes to support Seniors in the community.
- Continued a two-phase community co-op program with the Boys & Girls Club of Lancaster that entails the clean-up and planting of a
 community garden behind the Jack Walker Clubhouse in downtown Lancaster that will harvest locally grown, free produce for
 members, employees, and nearby residents. BGC members will also be treated to experiential STEM-oriented programming
 opportunities, as well as educational life skills involving health and wellness.
- Worked with YWCA Lancaster to support another woman-led organization by volunteering our time at their race packet pick-up for the annual Race Against Racism.
- Assisted Edible Classroom in volunteering at their first Community Outreach event for students of School District of Lancaster. JLL
 helped run family-friendly activities, put together raised beds and other supplies, and assisted in creating gardening kits for families
 to take home.

Donations/Drives

- Led a yearlong member-wide grocery card collection, to help provide free produce to communities that need it most. Raised \$500 in gift cards to support the initiative.
- Embarked on a new member project, partnering with the Lancaster Public Library, creating a teen food pantry, stocked with healthy snacks and toiletries. New members created a long-term plan in collaboration with the community impact committee, ensuring the pantry would be restocked on an ongoing basis.
- Led a donation drive to support high-need pantry staples at the Lancaster County Food Hub. Over 200 pantry items were donated.
- Led a donation drive to support hygiene, shelter, and personal care items for Winter Shelter utilizers. Over 160 pounds of items donated.

COMMUNITY IMPACT Continued...

New Initiatives

- Improved nutrition for the most vulnerable populations by introducing free pop-up markets that will offer immediate access to fresh fruits and vegetables to neighborhoods. Launched in Summer 2023, we hosted 5 pop-up markets, giving out more than 800 items of fresh fruits and vegetables. (Locations: Boys & Girls Club, Open Streets Lancaster, Lancaster Science Factory, Crispus Attucks Community Center, West End Art, Lancaster Public Library, Run for Luck)
- Secured a grant from Aetna Health, ensuring sustainable long-term support of the free pop-up produce initiative.
- Assisted in food waste elimination- Following daily support of the Central Market Program, members assisted with hand distributing remaining items to nearby nonprofits and businesses in need of fresh produce.

Community Gifts

- Provided the Central Market with 2, 6-foot tables and storage containers, ensuring they have the capability and ease to display fresh produce in an eye-pleasing and accessible way.
- Granted \$500 to assist with a translation stand for non-english speaking food bank utilizers at Crispus Attucks Community Center.
- Granted \$1,000 to Lancaster Public Library to encourage sustainability of teen pantry program that Junior League kicked off.

Training

- Developed a subcommittee, focused on ongoing education and resource sharing.
 - Joined the Hunger-Free Coalition as steering member.
- Welcomed Central PA Food Bank to our February GMM, educating our members on food accessibility in Lancaster County.

GRANTS & AWARDS

2024 DEBORAH P. ALTMAN OUTSTANDING YOUTH VOLUNTEER AWARD

Since 1984, the Junior League of Lancaster has awarded the Deborah P. Altman Outstanding Youth Volunteer Award annually to recognize young people for their exceptional commitment to voluntarism. Named after former president, the late Deborah P. Altman, this prestigious award has distributed nearly \$53,900.00 to outstanding youth in Lancaster County.

The 2024 recipient is Eloise Taylor, a graduating senior from Garden Spot High School. As founder and president of the Junior Friends of the ELANCO Library, she organizes community book sales and raises essential funds. Eloise also serves as class president and co-president of the National Honor Society, where she initiated Cinderella's Closet for prom attire and drives for essential student items. Additionally, she tutors students for the SAT and plans to major in Political Science at a four-year college.

Eloise received a \$1,500.00 scholarship and has designated a \$300.00 donation to the ELANCO Library.







We had such amazing fundraisers this Centennial Year of 2023-2024! It started with the Author's Event and continued on to the 100 for the 100th extraordinary event for Sustainers that was held at the Lancaster Museum of Art. Many people shared that it seemed like a reunion of the best sort! Additionally there were smaller fundraisers throughout the year that were accessed by Sustainers and Actives. As with any of these fabulous events, many of our Sustainers helped in the planning and execution of these events.

We were so fortunate this Centennial Year to have the extraordinary donation of \$30,000 from the Louise Steinman Von Hess Foundation. It took the diligent work and commitment of Karen Heinle to secure this donation. Additionally, Noelle Fassnacht, through her commitment to our League, was able to secure another donation of \$2500 from the Woodstream Foundation. Hats off to our Sustainers, Karen and Noelle!

With the commitment of Bunnie Buckwalter, we were able to have the Actives and Sustainers commit to being a part of the Fig Magazine in its Spring issue named The Rally 'Round Issue. We were able to have a wonderful two page spread in the magazine commemorating our Centennial Year! As the article was named, "Women Building a Better Community!" Thank you, Bunnie, for enabling us to make this happen.



The Sustainer Book Club, helmed by Kathleen McAllen, continued to be a mainstay, providing great conversation and insights into the book selections. Whether it was conversing on Lessons Of Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus, This Side Of Paradise by F. Scott Fitzgerald or The Warmth of Other Suns by Isabel Wilkerson, many of the women knew that they could have engaging conversations with our members.

On Saturday, April 20th, two tour groups, headed by Leslie McCarthy, Active and Pam Hoffmaster, Sustainer, had the pleasure of learning some little-known facts about events and personalities of the Junior League of Lancaster as they walked in downtown Lancaster. In some cases, some of our participants had personal stories to add to the well-researched tour. We must applaud the amazing research of Leslie McCarthy, who has spent an enormous amount of time combing the archives and newspaper articles.

During the downtown tours, we were thrilled to learn the identity of Miss Junior League 1926, who leapt from an airplane over Penn Square to promote the Junior League Follies that year. The front page of the April 11, 1926 newspaper carried her photo and declared "Miss Junior League Lands on Roof But Is Rescued ...the nervy aviatrix had planned to land in Penn Square but it seems she miscalculated a bit, and instead bounced off an apartment house roof on Broad Street, into the arms of Edward Hoover, 33 Broad Street." As her rescuer, Edward Hoover won a box for the opening night of the Follies and also got a guest for that evening- Miss Junior League 1926 herself, a mannequin. What a fun anecdote to hear about our JLL history! After many of us enjoyed the many "history lessons" of the day, many wondered...shouldn't all this information be compiled for a JLL book? We will see what history unfolds!

Each and every one of you, have continued to support our League in so many ways! Whether it be attending a meeting as a liaison to a committee, or attending an event planned by our Social Co-Chairs, you are connected. Whether you are calling another member to check in with them or sharing a smile, you are connected. We are so proud of the mighty Sustainer members, who continue to find that connection with our Junior League of Lancaster membership. We thank you for all you do for our membership and our community!



As I write this message, I am looking forward to the culmination of our Centennial Year with the Centennial Gala at Fulton Theater. It is going to be a great celebration of all of the events this year and the work and commitment of our sisterhood of Junior League members in the past 100 years! Thank you to all of our members who have planned this exciting Centennial Year.
