ABOUT THE JUNIOR LEAGUE

OUR MISSION

The Junior League of Lancaster (JLL) is an organization of women whose mission is to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration, and training. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

OUR HISTORY

On November 13, 1923, the Junior League of Lancaster held its first meeting at the YWCA in Lancaster City. Fifty-five young women were in attendance, and Laura Watt, temporary chairman, was elected the first president.

Today, the JLL continues the commitment that began over 100 years ago — connecting and supporting women of all races, religions, and backgrounds who demonstrate a commitment to voluntarism.

Our efforts support community-based partnerships that work to broaden the educational, culture, recreational, and health opportunities available to women and children within the Lancaster community.



President James Buchanan's Wheatland was acquired by the JLL in 1936 to be preserved for public education and enjoyment as a National Historic Landmark. Today, JLL Headquarters is located in the Carriage House on Wheatland grounds, all of which is maintained by LancasterHistory.

The Fund Development committee is proud to report that the Junior League of Lancaster had several successful Fund Development events throughout the 2024-2025 league year, including events with Bloombox, Kendra Scott, and Iron Hill Brewery. We also continued our participation in the Extraordinary Give, during which we were able to raise \$8,492.53! We also had a great year of giving from our Cornerstones sponsors. NEW MEMBERS IMPACT NUTRITION ACCESSIBILITY

During the 2024-2025 League year, the Junior League of Lancaster welcomed eight new members, known as Provisional Members. To achieve Active status, each class was tasked with planning and executing a Provisional Member Project that supports the Lancaster community. Under the guidance of the Membership Development Committee and League peers, these projects included:

The Fall Provisional Class partnered with PA Career Link Lancaster County to stock a pantry with emergency food items which serves many homeless individuals or those who are part of the Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed ("ALICE") population. They either do not have food or have limited funds to purchase food or nutritious items. The Fall provisional members were able to fully stock the pantry and give a \$300 donation.

NEW MEMBERS IMPACT NUTRITION ACCESSIBILITY

From Christine Roggenbaum, PA Career Link Lancaster County Site Administrator:

"One of our team members who works specifically with veterans, had a client come in today who is elderly and homeless. She is working to address the homelessness issue with him, but he was also without food. She took him to the kitchen and let him pick out food. He was so happy and grateful! After he left, the staff person came to my office in tears. She was so happy that we had the ability to help him on the spot. She could refer him to a food pantry, but he would have to be determined eligible. With our on-site program he could get what he needed right away. Thank you for supporting this initiative for our customers!"

NEW MEMBERS IMPACT NUTRITION ACCESSIBILITY

The Spring Provisional Class partnered with the Boys and Girls Club of Lancaster to provide summer camp counselors with bookbags filled with first aid and administrative items, and general camp needs for camp youth participants. The Spring provisional members brought all backpacks needed and went over and above for youth campers, including purchasing bathing suits for young girl campers.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Since 2022, our membership has conceived and executed several creative projects and programming endeavors in service of our IBCI (Issue-Based Community Impact) focus area of nutrition accessibility. Our intent is to make a meaningful impact in the social, economic and health implications of food waste and nutrition accessibility in our community. This has also resulted in close partnership with the key organizations and thought leaders in the community who are working to achieve measurable reform within Lancaster county.

Our efforts in the 2024-2025 league year included:

Direct Service

- Planted, tended and winterized community gardens for the Junior League of Lancaster's garden at the Boys and Girls Club and at local elementary schools with The Edible Classroom.
- Stocked shelves and supported neighbors at community pantries and food service at Crispus Attucks Community Pantry, Lancaster Chooses Love and Peter's Porch.
- Packed and delivered meals through Power Packs Project and holiday boxes with the Lancaster County Project for the Needy.
- Facilitated pop-up markets to bring fresh produce to community members during events, including the Lancaster Library's Earth Day Extravaganza.



COMMUNITY IMPACT *Continued...*

Direct Service

- Assisted with the relaunch of Central Market's After Market program, volunteering regularly to distribute remaining market items and reduce food waste.
- Collected food and necessity donations for local organizations, including Tenfold and Arch Street Center.

New Initiatives

- Facilitated projects for prospective members
 - Establishing Alice's Kitchen at PA CareerLink
 - Counselor backpacks for BGC summer camp

Community Gifts

- This year, for the first time, CI planned and executed a community Egg Hunt to raise food and monetary donations for the YWCA's children's center. Through community and JLL donations, we raised over 160 food items and over \$350 in support of the YWCA.
- The JLL approved a \$10,000 donation to Community Action Partnership (CAP) for an investment in a mobile food market. The mobile food market will fill a critical gap in the community, delivering fresh produce to community members and organizations that do not have access. We intend to continue our involvement with the mobile food market following the completion of the pilot in Summer 2025.

Training

- Community Impact was an active participant in the Hunger-Free Lancaster Coalition, serving alongside local organizations to create initiatives to help more members of Lancaster county participate in food programs.
- We welcomed Community Action Partnership (CAP) to our October GMM to educate our Membership food accessibility and food justice in Lancaster County

GRANTS & AWARDS

2024 DEBORAH P. ALTMAN OUTSTANDING YOUTH VOLUNTEER AWARD

Since 1984, the Junior League of Lancaster has awarded the Deborah P. Altman Outstanding Youth Volunteer Award annually to recognize young people for their exceptional commitment to voluntarism. Named after former president, the late Deborah P. Altman, this prestigious award has distributed nearly \$55,400.00 to outstanding youth in Lancaster County.

The 2025 recipient is Abigail Calkins, a graduating senior from Ephrata High School. Throughout her high school career, Abigail has demonstrated a passionate commitment to volunteerism, serving as an interpreter for Spanish and Portuguese speakers, assisting in English as a Second Language classes, and tutoring both middle and high school students. She also created and leads the Peer Tutor Club at Ephrata High School and has been active in various roles at her church and local house of prayer. Abigail plans to attend Grove City College, where she will major in Spanish.

Abigail received a \$1,500.00 scholarship and has designated a \$300.00 donation to Align Life Ministries.

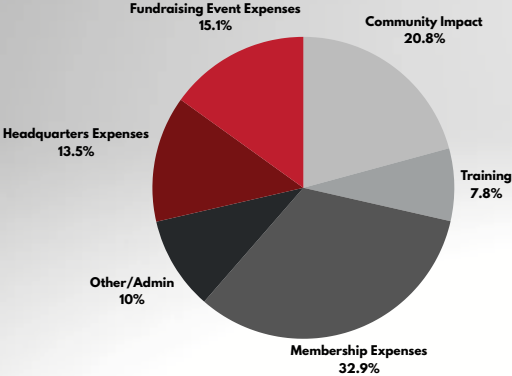

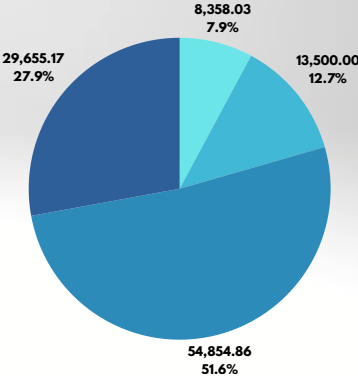
